Dear St. Dominic parishioners,

Today -- the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time -- is World Mission Sunday.

In every Catholic parish, we pray especially today for the missionary lands, where Jesus is still "unknown". The gift of Faith and the waters of Baptism must still "go out to all the nations."

Here is our own area, a century or two ago, mission priests came from Europe -- especially Germany, Italy and Ireland -- to pastor parishes urban and rural. In fact, over three hundred years ago, French missionary priests came to this wilderness and founded Holy Family Parish in Cahokia in 1699!

325 years of the Catholic Faith here in what is now our diocese!

In the 20th century, American priests went to far off mission lands ... today, priests from India and Africa come to help in our local parishes.
