Respect Life Corner: Killing the Pain, Not the Patient: Palliative Care vs. Assisted Suicide; *Read the full version at usccb.org/killing-the-pain.* Assisted suicide is in the news and on lawmakers' agendas. Supporters call it "aid in dying" & claim it's just another option for end-of-life care. But it's radically different from the practice of palliative care, the healing art of relieving pain and other distressing symptoms for patients who are seriously ill. Palliative care intends to comfort a patient, addressing physical, psychological, emotional, and spiritual needs. Assisted suicide, by contrast, directly intends the patient's death. It ignores any underlying problems, and instead abandons and eliminates the patient who has the problems. As a society and as individuals, we must dedicate ourselves to providing genuinely compassionate care that protects God's gift of life.

Holy Land Arts is here this weekend with items available for purchase. With the hostilities worsening in the Holy Land and due to lack of Christian pilgrims, unemployment rate increased to almost 70%. Ward Qumsieh is one of the few Christians that took the responsibility of helping Christians of the Holy Land market their hand crafts in the United States. Many Christian Palestinians have responded by fleeing the Holy Land. And, it is conceivable that all Christians could leave. However, the absence of a living Christian community is very dangerous for the Holy sites such as the Nativity Church in Bethlehem. By buying these engraved pieces of art, you help strengthen the Christian presence in the city of Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus Christ, and the surrounding areas. Proceeds go the Christians families (the artisans) who have been working hard to create these hand carvings. Purchasing one of these unique items will help prevent Christians from leaving the Holy Land and build new hope in keeping the Christian culture alive. Ward Qumsieh would be happy to speak with you. Parish needs financial help from all our parishioners. Currently the Church general fund was short in making the budget goal at the end of the fiscal year on June 30. There are also several building and maintenance problems being addressed this summer or shortly there after.

Building Fund:

- Replacing the parish center boiler (installed 1964) with new energy efficient model. The new boiler is being installed.
- Replacing three entry doors to the Church
- Replacing gym lighting with LED has been approved by IMEA and will be completed very soon.
- Repair and replace interior plaster of Church once outside waterproofing and doors are completed.
- Additional security cameras for the school are being discussed.
