Respect Life Corner—"When Saul arrived in Jerusalem, he tried to join the disciples, but they were afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple." In Reading 1 from Acts of the Apostles, we are aware of the conversion that Saul, now Paul encountered on the road to Damascus, when he encountered the Risen Christ. Christ implored him to stop persecuting Jewish followers of Jesus. Barnabas spoke on behalf of Saul, later Paul, and opened up a dialogue that no one in the circle of the disciples was expecting. Barnabas took Saul under his wing and gave him a proper introduction and a proper welcome into the Jewish Christian community. **Learn, Act, Connect and Pray**- In the Gospels, we see that Jesus is deeply involved with the concerns of individual people, not entities of power. Jesus teaches us to take the same path, the path of dialogue. Who can we begin to really talk and listen to here in our own community? We are called to engage in subsidiarity, working with people and communities nearest to a problem and encourage them as they work to devise a solution. Guide our efforts, Lord, to truly help serve the needs of the poor and the oppression, not for our sake, but for theirs.

Prayer for Safety of All in Agriculture Blessed Mary, Mother of God, and great Saint Joseph, you protected and kept safe the Divine Child, Jesus. We ask your special intercession and protection of all who work in Agriculture, especially on the farm. Act of Spiritual Communion It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting ourselves in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping Him in the consecrated bread and wine which are His Body and Blood. Always remember that the consecrated bread is the Body and Blood of Christ and the consecrated wine is the Body and Blood of Christ, even if you receive the Eucharistic only under one species. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. An act of Spiritual Communion increases our desire to receive sacramental Communion and helps us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

A Prayer for Spiritual Communion My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You in my body, my soul, and my whole being. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, Come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.
