A Word from Monsignor

My dear St. Dominic parishioners,

First of all, "Welcome back!" to Father Jim Nall - who is with you here at the parish for the November 2 and 3 Masses. I know you will happily greet him during the days of his "visit" - he will be going back to the facility for the rest of this month and will return to St. Dominic's on November 30.

Secondly, it has been my pleasure to be with you these past twelve **weeks.** Because of previous commitments, in November your neighboring pastor, Fr. Von Deeke of St. Francis in Aviston will serve as "temporary parish administrator" until Fr. Nall's return at the end of the month. I do plan to be here for several of the Friday morning school Masses, which I have so enjoyed.

Finally, I have asked the two parish trustees to share with you the information about the Open Positions in the St. Dominic Parish office:

In light of Tom Kannall's previously announced retirement, St. Dominic Parish is in need of an Accountant / Bookkeeper and an Office Manager.

The Accountant position is expected to be part-time (roughly 10 to 15 hours a week) and most of the tasks could be handled at one's home on their time with occasional responsibilities at the Rectory. Some of the responsibilities of this position include payment of all bills, processing of payroll twice a month, journalizing cash collections and producing, analyzing, and presenting financial statements out of QuickBooks. This position would be ideal for someone looking for some extra cash and flexibility in their schedule. Previous experience with QuickBooks is required.

The Office Manager position includes responsibility for all administrative, human resource, and parish database management functions. Other responsibilities include but are not limited to performance of Child Protection Location Coordination duties, coordination with various Church committees on their \$5,045.00 | needs, and supervision of the Parish Receptionist. This position would require presence in the Rectory, but it is possible this position could also be part-time and would be ideal for someone looking for extra money with a desire to be involved in Parish activities. The ideal candidate is organized, detail-oriented, excels at multi-tasking, and finds fulfillment in completing a task.
