A Letter From Fr. Jím

Dear Parishioners,

Please welcome Fr. Domínic Garamone, OSB, of St. Bede Abbey, in Peru, Illinois. Many know Fr. Dominic by the name of the "Bread Monk." He has given a presentation at Mater Dei Catholic High School this Saturday morning and is staying at St. Dominic Rectory. Fr. Dominic has offered to celebrate the Eucharist with the Parish this Saturday evening. Welcome Fr. Dominic! Thank you for break open the Word for us & breaking Bread with us.

Sometimes we can let fear get the best of us. We sometimes think FEAR stands for Forget Everything And Run. This can only lead us to avoidance and inaction and keep us in a state of perpetual anxiety. But FEAR can stand for two other things.

- 1. <u>False Evidence Appearing Real</u>: In other words, we believe imagined scenarios or distorted perceptions rather than real threats.
- 2. Face Everything And Rise: In other words, we confront fear and overcome challenges to achieve growth and success. This of course can not be achieved on our own but by asking God through prayer and meditation.

When we come to accept those things we cannot change, and understand the only thing we can control is how we react, and we ask for the insight to realize to know the difference, we find that FEAR is really a chance to ...

Face Everything and Rise.
