Dear Parishioners,

I don't know about you, but for me, it seems that times flies when we get to this time of the year. From Halloween to New Year's Day (it should go until Epiphany), we are in one, big holiday season. While these holidays give us opportunities to gettogether with families and friends, let's remember that the Church took over some pagan festivals and turned them into Holy Days that we celebrate today.

Halloween was once pagan, but The Church turned it into a celebration of saints. We celebrate ALL saints, those canonized and those not canonized.

The Solemnity of Christmas occurs when the pagans celebrate the time in which daylight begins to last longer. How Appropriate to celebrate the birth of Jesus who brings light into a dark world.

Although not a religious holiday, Thanksgiving lends itself for Catholics to gather for the Eucharist (which is Greek for Thanksgiving) and be mindful of the blessings God has given us.

Next Saturday is All Saints Day. Since it is a Saturday, obligation as a holy day is removed. However, here at St. Dominic, Mass is being celebrated on the 1st Saturday of the month. It's known as "Padre Pio" Mass. There will be Mass, next Saturday, at 9am.
