Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, a moment that marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and reveals His identity as the beloved Son of God.

This feast is not just about remembering an event in Jesus' life it's also an invitation for us to reflect on our own baptism and what it means for our daily living.

When Jesus stepped into the Jordan River, He didn't need to be cleansed of sin. Instead, He chose to stand in solidarity with us, entering the waters to sanctify them, so that through baptism, we too might be reborn as children of God. In that moment, the heavens opened, the Spirit descended like a dove, and the Father's voice declared: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

Our baptism is more than a ritual from the past, it is the foundation of our Christian identity. It is the moment we were claimed by God, filled with the Holy Spirit, and called to live as witnesses of Christ's love in the world. Just as Jesus' baptism launched Him into a mission of compassion, healing, and truth, our baptism sends us forth to bring light where there is darkness, hope where there is despair, and peace where there is division.
