His Holiness Pope Leo XIV has proclaimed this year, January 10, 2026 through January 10, 2027, as a special Year of St. Francis of Assisi in celebration of the 800th anniversary of his transitus (death).

During this Franciscan Jubilee Year, the Holy Father invites all the faithful to deepen their faith by reflecting on the life and example of St. Francis, a model of humility, peace & joyful witness to the gospel.

All Catholics, whether part of the Franciscan family or not, are encouraged to take part in the Jubilee graces. The Apostolic Penitentiary has granted a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions. Sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, prayer for the Pope's intentions, and a spirit detached from sin for those who make a pilgrimage to a Franciscan church or place of worship dedicated to St. Francis, participate in Jubilee devotions, or unite themselves spiritually to these celebrations.

This special year invites us to grow in Christian charity, pursue peace, and follow St. Francis' evangelical witness more faithfully in our daily lives.

Each year on January 22, all dioceses in the United States are called to observe a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. January 22 is the anniversary of the 1973 Supreme Court decisions that legalized abortion throughout our nation.

Since then, over 60 million lives have been lost. That's more than the size of Italy's population. On June 24, 2022, the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision overturned Roe v. Wade. While God, in His mercy, ended the nearly fifty-year nationwide regime of abortion on demand, state and federal laws, in many instances, are still hostile to preborn children. So, great prayer and advocacy is very needed. This coming Thursday, we set aside a day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. It is also a day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. We are each called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting, and/or giving alms.
