We are now one month into the new year.

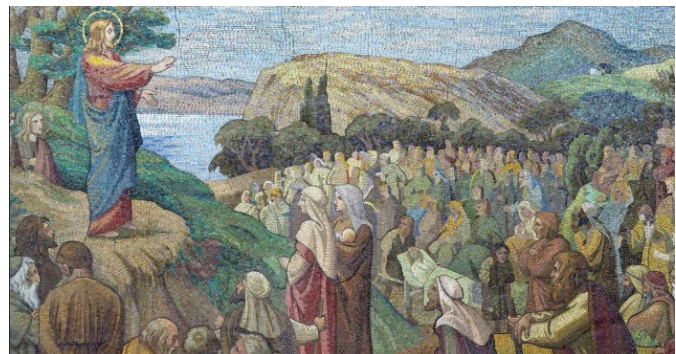
