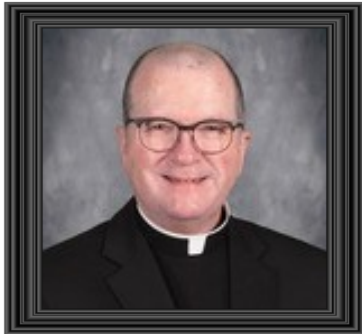

THE 5:30PM CHRISTMAS EVE MASS HAS BEEN MOVED TO 4:30PM. THE 10:30PM MASS & 9:00AM CHRISTMAS DAY MASS ARE STAYING AT THEIR SAME TIMES.

In light of Tom Kannall's previously announced retirement, St. Dominic Parish is in need of an Accountant / Bookkeeper and an Office Manager.

The Accountant position is expected to be part-time (roughly 10 to 15 hours a week) and most of the tasks could be handled at one's home on their time with occasional responsibilities at the Rectory. Some of the responsibilities of this position include payment of all bills, processing of payroll twice a month, journalizing cash collections and producing, analyzing, and presenting financial statements out of QuickBooks. This position would be ideal for someone looking for some extra cash and flexibility in their schedule. Previous experience with QuickBooks is required.

The Office Manager position includes responsibility for all administrative, human resource, and parish database management functions. Other responsibilities include but are not limited to performance of Child Protection Location Coordination duties, coordination with various Church committees on their needs, and supervision of the Parish Receptionist. This position would require presence in the Rectory, but it is possible this position could also be part-time and would be ideal for someone looking for extra money with a desire to be involved in Parish activities. The ideal candidate is organized, detail-oriented, excels at multi-tasking, and finds fulfillment in completing a task.

Starting with the First Sunday of Advent, we will introduce a new missal called *Breaking Bread*. This new resource will replace the *Glory & Praise*, *We Celebrate*, and the smaller missalettes. The decision to transition to *Breaking Bread* was made by the Liturgy Committee in collaboration with the Pastoral Staff and Pastoral Council. This change aims to enhance our worship experience in several ways: liturgical consistency, expanded selection of hymns, prayers and songs, and user-friendly design.

If you would like a 7-day votive prayer candle to be lit, please contact the Parish Office. Candles are \$5 per candle.

During the month of November there is a basket in the back of church for donations for nursing home residents. Suggestions for individual-sized items include shampoo, conditioner, body wash, body spray, nail brushes, nail files, tissues, socks, and puzzle books. Monetary donations are also welcome.

At the Veterans' Day Mass on Monday, November 11th at 8am there will be a special collection for The Joseph Center in East St. Louis. The Joseph Center provides housing & services to Veterans such as: developing life skills; medical, dental & mental health services; career counseling; job training & employment assistance; financial benefits assistance (SSI, SSDI, VA, GA, food stamps, etc.), substance abuse after care, along with individual and group counseling.

To honor and pray for our veterans, we invite all veterans to sign the Veterans Appreciation Poster located at the back of the church. Please leave your name and branch of service so we can recognize your commitment and sacrifice.
